RE: Sign-up/registration for the 2024-2025 school year

Preparations are now underway for the upcoming 2024-2025 season of Academic Challenge Bowl and the Interscholastic Chess League (ICL) programs; a season which is looking forward to expanded growth in participation as schools continue to expand extracurricular offerings.

Academic Challenge Bowl is a quiz bowl-style, academic team competition that effectively serves as a modified-level (grades 6, 7 and 8) version of the high school quiz bowl program MasterMinds. The ACB program gives students with academic strengths the opportunity to extend those talents against some of the brightest from other local schools. ACB's partner — Interscholastic Chess League — allows students a chance to test their analytical skills in the classic game of logic and strategy against the talents of students from other schools.

We are pleased to announce that schools will again have two ways to sign up for the programs: as a service of the Erie 1 BOCES or through the non-profit CYPRAS (which directs both programs). On the enclosed registration form, there are boxes to indicate the vendor for billing. There are no other forms that must be submitted (although non-component districts that opt to register with BOCES will need to submit a cross-contract form which can be provided by their home BOCES).

If you are unsure of interest among your students, you can schedule a demonstration where we come to your school -- either during lunch or after school -- and show your students what the programs are like. If you are interested, please contact Scott Kroner as soon as possible to schedule a demonstration.

The fee for Academic Challenge Bowl for the 2024-2025 season will be at \$514/team. The cost for a team in the Interscholastic Chess League stands at \$229 (if in an exclusively middle school league); otherwise the fee is \$374 (if playing in a league with high school teams). Non-component Erie 1 BOCES schools that sign up through BOCES are responsible for cross-contract fees. Schools signing up through CYPRAS may be eligible for some discounts in addition to avoiding cross-contract fees. Transportation remains the responsibility of each individual school although coordinated scheduling — having ACB and Chess in the same league — does allow schools to save on transportation. One bus; two teams! That is not a requirement; teams from the same school may choose to participate in different leagues.

To register and participate in ACB or Chess this year, , just one of the enclosed registration forms should be completed and returned, with a requested deadline of **Friday**, **October 18**, **2024**. The annual scheduling meeting for coaches, which sets the dates for competitions, will be held shortly thereafter. If you are considering working with another school to field a joint/shared team -- something that **is** permitted -- let us know. Previous non-participants in MasterMinds will still receive a new school orientation. Participating schools should forward the pre-scheduling form to the coach/advisor for submission.

Academic Challenge Bowl and Interscholastic Chess are great programs to offer to your students and the time has never been better to join some of the most popular academic programs around.
